





THE FUTURE OF SOUTH WINDSOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS

When the Ten-Year Plan was created in 2013, South Windsor had been experiencing declining enrollment for more than a decade. We began to see a change in this trend in the 2016-2017 school year. Over the past two years we have experienced a significant departure from this trend in our elementary schools. As a result, our demographers, Milone & MacBroom, have set a new trajectory for student enrollment.

The chart below illustrates historical and projected district enrollment (grades PK-12), showing the difference in the projections provided in 2017 against projections calculated in November 2018. Milone & MacBroom is now calling for 441 more students in 2025 than they did just one year ago. With this in mind, the Board of Education recently approved revised Educational Specifications for both Phase Two schools. These revisions have allowed for the inclusion of two additional classrooms at Eli Terry and three additional classrooms at Philip R. Smith.
